- help students understand complex international interdependencies in the global economy and invite outside agencies to facilitate this where possible
- To promote student voice in local, national and international contexts empowering them to participate in discussions of global relevance.
- To celebrate international diversity through a range of events
- To engage our whole school community in the process of constant self-evaluation on the global dimension in order to reflect on our provision of the global ethos in our teaching and learning.
- Working with membership organisations and the wider GEMS Education network of schools.
